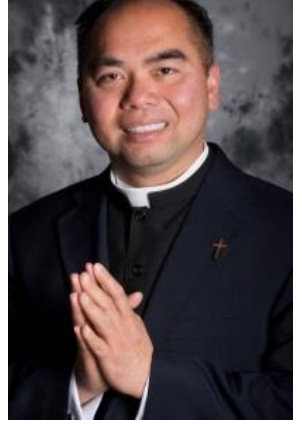

My brothers and sisters in the Christ Jesus,

As Election Day approaches, I wish to present to all of you the summary of **Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship**. There will be three inserts: *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship (Bulletin October 22-23, 2016)*; *The Challenge of Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship part I (Bulletin Oct. 29-30, 2016)*. *The Challenge of Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship part II (Bulletin Nov. 5-6, 2016)*. We have to look past the heated rhetoric and slogans to discern whether there is a candidate in each race who can advance the common good, protect life, and advance human dignity in its many manifestations. When there are such candidates, we should feel free to vote for them, in spite of party affiliations.



In some races we may discover that there is not a candidate that we can in good conscience support and choose to abstain from voting in that particular race.



In choosing among flawed candidates, we ought never to fall into the trap of thinking we must choose the lesser of two evils. We may never choose evil. However, we can choose a candidate who with reasonable probability will be most likely do some good and limit the amount of harm done.

This is true especially concerning those foundational issues such as protecting the right to life, strengthening the family and preserving conscience rights and religious liberty.

There is much at stake on November 8. I ask you to pray, to study the candidates and issues, and then to vote. May our Blessed Virgin Mary under the title of her Immaculate Conception, Patroness of the United States and Saint Boniface, pray for us!

Why Priesthood Sunday (October 30th) Is Important (from Serra International Website www.serraus.org)

The reasons for this celebration (of Priesthood Sunday) should be obvious. The number of priests per Catholic has declined over the past 40 years. This makes it more difficult for individual parishioners to establish a close relationship with any one particular priest. When I was growing up, our pastor served in our parish for 34 years. My mom and dad knew him well. His presence and service were significant factors in the story of my own vocation. Furthermore, priests are no longer the only ones who offer pastoral care to our people. Yet without a priest, no parish is able to be a Eucharistic community. It is important to reaffirm the importance of the priesthood of Jesus Christ and its central place in the life of our Church.

Communion must be received each day we wish to gain the indulgence, but we only need to go to Confession once during the period. And, as with all plenary indulgences, we must pray for the [intentions of the Holy Father](#) (one [Our Father](#) and one [Hail Mary](#)) each day we perform the work of the indulgence.
