### February 14-St. Valentine

Patron of Greetings

St. Valentine, a Roman priest and physician, together with St. Marius and his family, assisted the martyrs who suffered during the reign of Emperor Claudis II in the 3<sup>rd</sup> century. Being apprehended, he was sent to the Prefect of Rome, who commanded that he be beaten with clubs and afterward beheaded, suffered martyrdom. A basilica was erected in his honor.

The custom of sending valentines on this day is the revival of an ancient pagan practice which consisted in boys drawing the names of girls in honor of their goddess, Februata Juno. To abolish this practice names of saints were substituted on ballets drawn upon this day. It also stems from a medieval belief that birds began to pair on February 14.
