Presentation-February 2

Presentation of the child Jesus in the temple, also called the feast of the purification. Another name for this popular feast is Candlemas Day. Forty days after his birth Mary and Joseph brought Jesus to the Temple of Jerusalem to present him to the Lord as the law of Moses prescribed. They carried with them the usual offering of the poor a pair of turtledoves. The law of Moses commanded that the first-born male child should be offered to God in thanksgiving for the sparing by the exterminating angel, of the Israelites in Egypt.
