
## From the Pastor's Desk

# Lenten Season 2019

We are about to leave Lent and enter the liturgical season known as "Triduum." What is this season, and why does the Church say that it is "the culmination of the entire liturgical year"?

"Triduum" comes from Latin roots that mean, essentially, "the three days" or "period of three days". Today it refers to the liturgical season that follows Lent and precedes the Easter season. According to a document named [Paschales Solemnitatis: #38](#)...*This time is called "the triduum the crucified, buried and risen"; it is also called the "Easter Triduum" because during it is celebrated the Paschal Mystery, that is, the passing of the Lord from this world to his Father.*

The begin and ending of these three days, according to the [General Norms for the Liturgical Year and the Calendar: 19](#). *The Easter triduum begins with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper, reaches its high point in the Easter Vigil, and closes with evening prayer on Easter Sunday.* This means that Triduum thus runs from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. It thus includes three full days, though since the season doesn't begin at midnight, these three days are distributed as follows: The last part of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday, The first part of Easter Sunday.



The Triduum is very important celebrations. According to the General Norms: 18. *Christ redeemed us all and gave perfect glory to God principally through his paschal mystery: dying he destroyed our death and rising he restored our life.* Therefore, the Easter triduum of the passion and resurrection of Christ is the culmination of the entire liturgical year. Thus, the solemnity of Easter has the same kind of preeminence in the liturgical year that Sunday has in the week.

Fasting is observed. According to Paschales Solemnitatis: 39. *The Easter fast is sacred on the first two days of the Triduum, during which, according to ancient tradition, the Church fasts "because the Spouse has been taken away."* Good Friday is a day of fasting and abstinence; it is also recommended that Holy Saturday be so observed, in order that the Church with uplifted and welcoming heart be ready to celebrate the joys of the Sunday of the resurrection. Fasting and abstinence are thus required on Good Friday and fasting is recommended on Holy Saturday.

Please make every effort to attend these days.

The month of April is traditionally dedicated to devotion to Jesus in the sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. The Catholic Church teaches that the Blessed Sacrament is the real and living presence of Christ - His Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity - received into our souls with every reception of Holy Communion. Our Eucharistic Lord is the source and summit of our Christian life, the ultimate proof of His infinite love for us.

**John 6: 53-56:** Jesus said to them, "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him."
