From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This weekend we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord. It is a wonderful opportunity to reflect on the great gift that we have been given in the Sacrament of Baptism. This Sacrament is the beginning of our life of grace, and it opens our soul to receiving the graces of the other Sacraments as well. In seminary, we learned about the three predominant movements that happen in the Sacrament of Baptism. The first is that sin is removed; we are cleansed from original sin; although we still feel its effects throughout our life, we enter into the life of grace that was purchased for us through the Passion of Christ. The second is that we become adopted sons and daughters of God; we share in His Divine Life (grace) and enter into a deeper relationship with Him. Thirdly, we become members of the Church; the Sacrament is our entry into not only the Sacramental life of the Church and the graces that we receive from God, but also into the larger Body of Christ of all Christian believers. Baptism changes our very soul in some way, leaving an indelible mark which forever identifies us as Christians, either for our glory in Heaven or our shame in hell.

It is good for us to remember our Baptism because it speaks directly to our identity as sons and daughters of God. That is why so many Sacramentals point back to our Baptism. The use of Holy Water, the Sign of the Cross, the sprinkling rite during Mass in Eastertime all remind us of who we have become from the moment of our Baptisms. The other Sacraments help us continue to bring the baptismal garments of our soul unstained into eternal life, especially the Sacrament of Confession. Continued use of these Sacraments and Sacramentals will aid us in living the full life to which God invites us.
