From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As we continue with the Gospel of the Baptism in the Jordan, we can look some more at this wonderful Sacrament. The Catechism is a wonderful source of our understanding of the Sacraments, and it describes the various names for Baptism in paragraphs 1214-1216. Throughout the tradition of the Church, there have been several names that are used for it. Baptism itself comes from the Greek word for “plunge” or “immerse”. This calls to mind the way in which the water of Baptism signifies the person’s burial into Christ’s death, dying to self and to sin, and then rising again to new life. It has also been called “the washing of regeneration and renewal by the Holy Spirit”, because through Baptism we are cleansed of our sins and reborn into the family of God. Divine life comes into our soul and gives us a new life of grace. Finally, Baptism is called “enlightenment” because it opens our minds and souls through grace to the truths of God and His work in the world.

Finally, there is a description from the Church Father St. Gregory of Nazianzus: “Baptism is God's most beautiful and magnificent gift. . . . We call it gift, grace, anointing, enlightenment, garment of immortality, bath of rebirth, seal, and most precious gift. It is called gift because it is conferred on those who bring nothing of their own; grace since it is given even to the guilty; Baptism because sin is buried in the water; anointing for it is priestly and royal as are those who are anointed; enlightenment because it radiates light; clothing since it veils our shame; bath because it washes; and seal as it is our guard and the sign of God's Lordship.”

These names are reflected in the various parts of the Baptismal Rite; the pouring or submerging in water, the anointing with the oil of Catechumens and the oil of Sacred Chrism, the lighting of the baptismal candle from the Easter candle, and the clothing in a white baptismal garment. So next time we are blessed to have a Baptism during Mass, I encourage you to watch and listen for these signs and symbols of the deeper reality of what is happening! And let’s continue to strive to live out the promises that were made at our Baptisms to live as children of the light and as sons and daughters of the King.
